Childbirth Education Classes, SLV Health Grizzly Center

Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP)

NFP is a free maternal and early childhood health home visitation program proven to foster long-term success for first-time moms, their babies, and society. NFP pairs pregnant and first-time mothers with a caring maternal and child health registered nurse for ongoing home visits aimed at supporting mothers and families in providing the very best start for their children during the earliest, most developmentally critical years. This program allows nurses to deliver the support first-time moms need to have a healthy pregnancy, become knowledgeable and responsible parents, and provide their babies with the best possible start in life. WIC is a free supplemental nutrition program that serves pregnant women, postpartum women and children up to their fifth birthday. A major goal of the WIC program is to improve the nutritional status of infants; WIC mothers are encouraged to breastfeed their infants and those who do are provided information through counseling and breastfeeding educational materials. Breastfeeding mothers receive follow up support and are eligible to participate in WIC longer than non-breastfeeding mothers. Mothers who exclusively breastfeed their infants also receive an enhanced food package. Breast pumps are available to help support the initiation and continuation of breastfeeding.
